Oshkosh turned a \$3,000 grant into a \$300,000 accessible playground!

Communities best know what they need:

- Oshkosh used their grant to plan and build an accessible playground. Their effort which also received generous private and public support, resulted in a playground the whole community uses valued at nearly \$300,000! They now consult with other communities in the Midwest on how to build their own accessible park and the Oshkosh parks program has created inclusive programs and park options citywide.
- Waukesha's Adaptive Community Approach Program (ACAP) members living with disabilities made a video to educate the disability community about their voting rights and access to the polls.
- A group in Ozaukee County worked with the local community to increase the availability of accessible taxicabs in West Bend. They also extended service extended from 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm on weeknights and all day on Saturday.
- A group partnered with a local harvesting team at community-supported farms to create jobs for people with disabilities.
